An Urgent Reponse to Recent Predictions


Recently I received a phone call from a sincere soul who I love dearly, telling me that probation for the church will close sometime in March next year. We only have a few months to go. And they appealed to me to watch a video by David Gates - Uncle David as he is affectionately called.

So I watched the video. Now after watching the video I want you to know that I believe David Gates is a sincere and faithful man of God. I also AGREE 100% with the tenor of his message, namely, Get ready, get ready, get ready! We are to be ready TODAY, right now in THIS SEALING TIME. However my concern is his preaching of definite time for events that the SOP says we are

not to preach definite time on. Now, there are certain prophetic events that we are to act upon. We are to know what events are coming--both on earth and in heaven-namely the Sunday law, the blotting out of sin in the final work of the atonement, the universal death decree, the close of probation, the seven last plagues, and the time of Jacob's trouble when you and I will stand on earth without a mediator. And these will come just as soon as God's people are ready. But NOTE, and this is IMPORTANT: The universal Sunday law is brought as a RESULT of the preaching of the third angel's message in power under the LATTER RAIN. Not the other way around. Latter Rain falls FIRST, then the Sunday laws come as a RESULT. (See Early Writings p.33-34; 85-86; 271; GC 604, 606, 607; 5T 452-453; 6T 18, 395:1; 7T 141; 8T 607:1; COL 412; 4SP 444-445. 7BC 984:4.)

And WHEN will the Latter Rain fall?

NOTE:

"Not one of us will ever receive the seal of God while our characters have one spot or stain upon them. It is left with us to remedy the defects in our characters, to cleanse the soul temple of every defilement. THEN the latter rain will fall upon us as the early rain fell upon the disciples on the Day of Pentecost." {5T 214.2}

Hence, we need to be preparing for the Latter Rain, not the Sunday law. And we SHOULD NOT and DO NOT need the excitement of "definite time" messages to motivate us.

"The Lord showed me that the message must go, and that it must not be hung on time; for time will never be a test again. I saw that some were getting a false excitement, arising from preaching time, that the third angel's message can stand on its own foundation, and that it needs not time to strengthen it, and that it will go with mighty power, and do its work, and will be cut short in righteousness." (1SM 188.3)

That last phrase, cut short in righteousness is significant. Malachi 3:1-3 applies to us today.

"Behold, I will send my messenger, and he shall prepare the way before me: and the Lord, whom ye seek, shall suddenly come to his temple, even the messenger of the covenant, whom ye delight in: behold, he shall come, saith the LORD of hosts. But who may abide the day of his coming? and who shall stand when he appeareth? for he [is] like a refiner's fire, and like fullers' soap: And he shall sit [as] a refiner and purifier of silver: and he shall purify the sons

of Levi, and purge them as gold and silver, that they may offer unto the LORD an offering in righteousness."

Jesus right now as our High Priest in the heavenly sanctuary is purifying his people that they may offer an offering to the LORD in righteousness. When will that offering be offered? Just as soon as you and I are perfected in character. And this can be right now today. Today we are to let the message of Christ our righteousness take hold of us in such a way that we manifest perfect obedience to all the commandments of God today-not tomorrow, not in four months' time, but today. Today we are to let our light shine to the world. Today God's glory is to fill the earth under the movement of Revelation 18:1-3-His character reflected in you and me.

"Those who wait for the Bridegroom's coming are to say to the people, "Behold your God." The last rays of merciful light, the last message of mercy to be given to the world, is a revelation of His character of love. The children of God are to manifest His glory. In their own life and character they are to reveal what the grace of God has done for them. {COL 415.5} "The light of the Sun of Righteousness is to shine forth in good works—in words of truth and deeds of holiness." {COL 416.1}

"The members of the church, those whom He has called out of darkness into His marvelous light, are to show forth His glory. The church is the repository of the riches of the grace of Christ; and through the church will eventually be made manifest, even to "the principalities and powers in heavenly places," the final and full display of the love of God. Ephesians 3:10." {AA 9.1}

This is our message.

"I have no specific time of which to speak when the outpouring of the Holy Spirit will take place—when the mighty angel will come down from heaven, and unite with the third angel in closing up the work for this world; my message is that our only safety is in being ready for the heavenly refreshing, having our lamps trimmed and burning." (RH March 29, 1892).



...time will never be a test again. I saw that some were getting a false excitement, arising from preaching time.

"The great outpouring of the Spirit of God, which lightens the whole earth with His glory, will not come until we have an enlightened people, that know by experience what it means to be laborers together with God. When we have entire, wholehearted consecration to the service of Christ, God will recognize the fact by an outpouring of His Spirit without measure; but this will not be while the largest portion of the church are not laborers together with God."—Review and Herald, July 21, 1896.

So, beloved, let us stay safe. Keep your lamp trimmed and burning. Keep your faith strong in the Lord. And let's unite wholeheartedly in giving all we have to share this last message of warning to the world today. To do so, God needs your time, your talents and your means. We have a lot of work to do. People are needed. And finances are

needed. So I am appealing to you to please return a faithful tithe so that we can carry forward the pastoral evangelism work effectively. Schofield's Cooking Demo

8, 15, 22 October 2018

How quickly the time came for the Schofields Church to once again hold another series of Vegetarian Cooking Classes. These took place on three consecutive Monday evenings during October.

It was nice to see once again many familiar faces present and was awe-some to meet new ones too. They all enjoyed listening to the health talks that were presented by Domenic and Danica. The attendees were then eager to see-how and to sample-taste each of the dishes demonstrated by Rosetta, Amy, Vivian, Tanya and myself. As always, a great 'thank you' to those who gave presentations and all those who helped in various ways.

The first health lecture in this series was taken by Domenic, entitled "A vegetarian lifestyle". He spoke about the benefits of vegetarianism, which has been very topical in the news of late. The World Health Organization made a statement declaring that red meat has high chances of causing cancer, especially Colorectal cancer. Processed



meat is directly linked with the risk in developing colorectal cancer and associated with stomach cancer. A large amount of red meat strongly links with pancreatic and prostate cancer. Domenic also shared some myths and facts of Vegetarianism. He talked about unhealthy and healthy vegetarians. Just because one is a vegetarian does not mean that they are healthy, it all depends what the body is fed.

Danica had the second health segment and her topic was "The secret ingredient to good health and longevity."



When we are born, we inherit the gut bacteria from our mothers. Whatever problems the mother has may be passed down to the next generation—a birthright for life. Over the years we continue to influence the balance of intestinal bacteria by the things which we eat and other lifestyle habits.

Our gut health depends on what we feed our bodies. What is put inside will determine what kind of health we will have. Just like preparing the soil before we plant a good garden, if we fertilize the soil, we will be sure to have a good crop. The same is true with our bodies—if we feed the body the right things, we will reap the benefits.

Certain foods feed certain bacteria. What we eat determines what types of bacteria will proliferate. Therefore, it is best to avoid processed and refined foods and feed the body with a simple and wholesome plant-based diet. To feed your friendly bacteria well, include in the daily diet at least one type of legume and have a high amount of fibre.

Our last topic was also taken by Danica, "Eat the colours of the Rainbow."

We started with red foods. Foods that are red contain a powerful antioxidant called lycopene. Some examples of these are red apples, cherries, red grapefruit, tomatoes and watermelon. There have been lots of studies done on this range of food and the findings are exciting. Red foods have positive effects on the following: eye health, Alzheimer's disease, epileptic seizures, all things related to heart health, including blood pressure, heart attacks, arteriosclerosis. For bone health, they have been found to slow down bone cell death. Lycopene-containing foods have also been found to help with fungal infections.

Orange and yellow foods contain beta carotene. Examples of these





include, pumpkin, sweet potatoes, carrots and oranges. The body converts beta carotene to vitamin A, which is also another antioxidant. Antioxidants are important in the prevention of disease and slowing down the aging process.

Beta carotene has been found to be very important in pregnancy and breastfeeding, as it plays a vital role in the development of the child. It helps protect the skin from the sun. It is also very important in eye health and keeping your respiratory system in good shape.

Green foods contain chlorophyll. Chlorophyll is very important in the prevention of cancer. It cleanses the liver. Chlorophyll slows the growth rate of harmful bacteria and has



been found to be useful with weight loss management. Chlorophyll also contains magnesium as a key part of its structure. There is a long list of things magnesium is vital for such as insomnia, hyperactivity, sugar metabolism and anxiety.



The last colours we talked about in our rainbow were the blues and purples. These are a pretty class of foods. They include, blueberries, plums, grapes, and purple sweet potatoes. This class of foods contain anthocyanin, yet another powerful antioxidant!

In a huge study done on nurses it was found that those who ate blueberries at least once a week had much fewer cases of heart disease, hypertension and/or heart attack than those who didn't eat these anthocyanin-containing berries. It was also seen in other studies to help protect against diabetes. These powerful foods were also seen to improve cognitive performance. Eye health also improved with these pretty foods.

Every time we are tempted to just fill our plates with some white pasta, white rice or white potatoes, stop!
Remember all the beautiful colours that God has made for us to eat and their long list of health benefits. Train your taste buds to enjoy them. Soon you will be craving them and reaping their many to your health.

A big hit was the "Peanut Butter Ice Cream". With Summer just around the corner, we thought you may enjoy making this scrumptious and very easy recipe:

Peanut Butter Ice Cream INGREDIENTS

- 2½ cups unsweetened almond milk
- 1¼ cups pitted Medjool dates
- ½ cup natural peanut butter
- ¾ cup raw cashew butter*
- 2 teaspoons pure vanilla extract
- ¾ teaspoon fine-grain sea salt

METHOD

Have on hand an air-tight container to place the ice cream into when ready. Makes approximately 1½ litres.

In a high-speed blender, combine the almond milk, dates, peanut butter, cashew butter, vanilla, and sea salt. Blend on high for about 3 minutes (depending on your blender) or until completely smooth. Pour the ice cream mixture into the air-tight container and place in the freezer. Freeze until it sets. Its best to leave it for at least 6-8 hours.

Prior to serving, it is also best to take the ice cream out of the freezer for to soften. Leave it at room temperature for 10-15 minutes, depending on the weather.

Stores in freezer for up to 1 week.

Notes

* To make your own cashew butter: blend 3 cups raw cashews in a food processor until smooth (it will be very thick) stopping to scrape down the sides as needed. If the cashew butter is still too chunky then add 1 tablespoon of water to encourage blending into a creamy cashew butter. Keep refrigerated.

Until the next time! May God impress upon our minds to be more considerate and kinder to our bodies so that we can present it as a healthy place for the indwelling of the Holy Spirit.




come true for Sister Elaine Weymark, who is thrilled to be able to have a proper shop to serve the community.


Elizabeth Fisther's Baptism

Giulio's Life Sketches as told by his



daughter Anna Allen:

Dad was born in a small-town village by the name 'Cepic' in the Northern side of Croatia. He was the last child born to a family of four siblings. He was very close to his mother and loved her dearly, a special bond that lasted ten years. Dad had a strong desire to be adventurous, try new things and see the world.

Dad was an inspirational family man, caring and loving. Dad would make sure his family always came first, especially when faced with hard times, making sure we had food on the table and clothes and shoes to wear. Together with Mum, he made sure their children were taken good care of. He was the one to look to, whenever in doubt, or when we needed guidance, words of knowledge and advice, he was always there.

Which brings me to the first chapter of my life, as a little girl. I remember I had just turned 7 and time for school had started. I looked forward to this episode in my life, yet I was full of uncertainty, yet I looked forward to this milestone in my young years. Mum and Dad both took me to school that early summer morning, Dad said to me that he was carrying





a pencil to give to me when we got to school, he had it in his pocket. I was excited and overjoyed, but sadly he had forgotten it, I cried and was sad that day.

Dad being of European background and new to our country, he still spoke a fair amount of Croatian, which meant from time to time he would talk to us in Croatian dialect. I guess he wanted us to be able to get to know his background. He brought with him not only a different culture to ours, but also the memories that made him, the boy, the teenager, and the man that he was. He loved sharing with us his music, folk songs from his hometown. Not only did he sing them to us and Mum, but also whenever possible he would take the time to tell us what 'those' songs meant, for he made sure we knew and understood why he wanted to share this with us. It was a time of reflection that took him back to his roots, his hometown, his family. Many times, whenever he shared these sweet memories he would end up in tears, for it brought sad memories of his hometown and family he had left behind.

Dad was a hard-working man from very early years of his life. The eagerness and willingness he employed with him in every project he ever put his mind to. He loved building things, putting things together or from scratch.

Our first home in Chile bears the 'Trade of the Art'. 'Welding' 'steel' and 'cement' were the main materials that he used to erect a beautiful two-story house in Chile, where some of 'us' learnt to take our first steps. This house was the biggest project he endeavored to pursue, form scratch to almost finish state.

This was his pride and joy in every way possible.

As fate would have it, Dad loved adventure and traveling abroad, looking for something better for his family. Mum and Dad were not happy with the conditions of the country at the time. We believe God had it all in His masterplan and a new door of opportunities opened for them and us their children. New beginnings, new windows of hope were on the horizon as this new adventure was taking place. The time had come to embark and embrace 'new everything'. Before all this was to take place, we, as a family, were to impress the Australian Ambassador. So Dad would prepare the words he was to say... Mr. Ambassador, this is my family. We could not hold our joy as we were getting ready for the unknown before us.

Here is where a story of courage, heroism, bravery and valor was born. This marked a stamp of approval to what was in store for us, an unknown future in a new country and new beginnings.

It's been a little over three years since we lost our 'Mum'. Dad became more than a hero to me, we became closer and our relationship grew stronger as now we were both walking with the same shoes on down the same road without our life companions, nonetheless we encouraged each other with better things to come. Whenever possible, I would visit Dad more often than I did before. We would comfort each other, that we would see our loved ones gone once again. I would share with him words of comfort, of peace and of joy, that we have the hope of a wonderful future together with the Lord. Dad loved reading



the Bible, its promises gave him the hope that one day all the sad things will pass away. Dad took encouragement from our times spent together, we would also read the Word of God, sing hymns which brought hope and peace to his heart.

For months and weeks on end Dad put lots of effort in learning and memorising this beautiful hymn "Lord Jesus, I long to be Perfectly Whole" hymn number 345 in the Reformation Hymnal. We have a short clip where he sings it in Spanish, "Anhelo Ser Limpio". He sang in tune whenever possible and shared it with us many times. While singing it, he would be in tears as he was touched by God's wondrous love and His Spirit. Bro Ben recorded it in one his visits to dad's place.

Because of Christ's grace and righteousness, we will see Dad again when the fulfillment of 1 Thessalonians 4:16-18 takes place: "For the Lord himself shall descend from heaven with a shout, with the voice of the archangel, and with the trump of God: and the dead in Christ shall rise first: Thenwe which are alive and remain shall be caught up together with them in the clouds, to meet the Lord in the air: and so shall we ever be with the Lord. Where-



fore comfort one another with these words."

God's promises: "And God shall wipe away all tears from their eyes; and there shall be no more death, neither sorrow, nor crying, neither shall there be any more pain: for the former things are passed away." Revelation 21:4.

And on that day in heaven,



I see the travail of my soul,


