Prophecy Seminar – Rockhampton, QLD



From the 17 – 23rd June, 2012, the “Meltdown to Eternity” Bible Prophecy Seminar was held in Rockhampton, QLD. Br. Paul Chapman presented the message each night, and local QLD youth, together with Brn. Hayden Wiseman and Sam Wiseman, presented a musical item to commence and close each meeting.

The main thrust of advertising was 10,000 flyers delivered via Australia Post, a half page newspaper ad in the Rockhampton “Morning Bulletin” (a local paid newspaper – 15,000 circulation), 50 x A3 Posters, community announcements on local radio and television, and word of mouth.

The Seminar got underway on time 7:00pm Sunday night. There were 8 visitors present and all of them expressed positive comments at the conclusion of the first night’s presentation. All indicated they would return for each night.

At least 8 - 10 visitors attended every night. Four more visitors attended at various nights, bringing the total visitors for the week to 12. One of the visitors is a pastor who has recently accepted the Sabbath. He conducts a home church meeting each Sabbath and has invited us to visit with him next time we are in Rockhampton.

Thursday night's presentation, entitled “God's Mark of Deliverance”, brought out the truth of the Sabbath and its purpose as a sign of creation and redemption. Br. Chapman informed the visitors present that he would be speaking on Sabbath morning at the local CWA hall, where he would look at nine New Testament verses that many Christian's use to support Sunday sacredness. As a result of the invitation three visitors also attended the Sabbath morning meeting. They also stayed for the combined fellowship lunch.



We also had on hand 50 pre-recorded DVD’s on the topic presented the first night – [“The New World Order: Will it Succeed?”](#). (These had been recorded by Br. Chapman with the help of Br. Bruce Powell in NSW a few weeks before the seminar.) Each night we encouraged visitors to take these to hand out to their friends. By the end of the week, our supply of 50 was exhausted. All have requested DVD’s of the entire series of presentations which were recorded on video. We hope to have these available for distribution shortly.

Beyond those that attended the meetings, we received seven requests for the [free pre-recorded DVD](#) from people who were not

able to attend the evening meetings. We also received nine reply paid requests for "The Great Controversy" book which was offered with the 10,000 flyers that went out.

All in all we have 27 new non-Adventist contacts that have been touched in some way by this outreach effort so far.

Elim Health Medical Missionary School 2012 - Commencement

Elim Health Medical Missionary School commenced its first training program on the 2nd July 2012 at Elim heights campground. There were nine students enrolled in the one year distance education course where the basics of natural medicine will be studied. The first semester covers the fundamentals of anatomy and physiology. The students were given a series of lectures by Br Alasdair Pow based upon their textbooks on the human organism and the skeletal system. They will continue during the next four months to study into the eleven organ systems that make up the human organism. In November they will sit a three hour closed book examination, as part of the nationally accredited assessment for this unit of the course.



The students were also given some theoretical and practical demonstrations in foot relaxation techniques and remedial massage by Sisters Susan Lausevic and Tanya Gordon respectively. In order to better understand the practical nature of remedial massage, Sr. Tanya challenged the students with two assessments covering the theory of massage including ethics and practice, as well as the anatomy of the body. Students were required to identify the major muscles and bones of the skeletal system as they related to massage practice. All students were given an opportunity to practice upon each other the techniques taught.

Br Britain conducted a series of lectures on the basis for medical missionary endeavour. The lectures highlighted the importance of combining the gospel message with the health message, and how it can prove a blessing towards humanity when conducted aright.

The weather was rather cold in the mornings and evenings but the middle of day were a bit warmer. Sisters Danica Tyler, Fulga Batger and Anda were in charge of providing the students meals with some other sisters helping out also. Br Geoff McCutcheon proved a great help by transporting many people and materials back and forth to the camp ground and airports. The week was enjoyed by all and will be followed up by the next training session in the beginning of November where the students will be learning the fundamentals of Human Nutrition.

Sis. Shirley Dorothy Valmae Roberts passed away in the early hours of Thursday morning 29 March, 2012 with her son and daughter Scott and Cherry and grand-daughter Micah by her side at the age of 83. She had endured the past 3 and a half year's bed ridden from Dementia and Alzheimer's disease. It was a true blessing to have her live at home in familiar surroundings with her family and pets. She had some wonderful carers come in to help the family who have stayed good friends of the family. She is survived by her children John, Paul, Cherylene, Paulene, Andrea, Scott and Regena, 9 grand children and 2 great grandchildren.

The funeral was held at home. This was a comfort for the family. This was where she had spent the last few years of her life and it was a fitting place for a final farewell from this world till Jesus' return. Bro. Matthias Thiel kindly came down from Auckland to conduct the service and Sis

Elizabeth Thiel and Sis Chantelle Nilsen supplied the music. The family wishes to thank them for their care and support. She was buried at the local cemetery in Patea. Family and friends spent that following evening staying up till the late hours sharing memories, laughs, and looking at photos of her life.

Shirley was born in Australia to Thomas and Maud Roberts in Wharoonga, Sydney on the 4th April 1928. She was an only child.

While attending Avondale College she met Reginald Bayne and they were married in 1950. Together they had seven children.

Life was busy for her right from the start. Her parents were an older couple so she looked after them while working and eventually starting her own family. Various things she did over the years consisted of her working as a VAD helper, governess in the outback, and working at the government stores, and then became a fulltime mother which continued on to bringing up some of her grandchildren.

There were many interests and hobbies that she had but her great loves were family, children, music - particularly Handel's Messiah and the hymns 'Glorious things of thee are spoken' and 'What a friend we have in Jesus', flowers, and animals - especially cats. She had a strong faith which helped her cope through the rough times in life. This faith she passed on and shared with her family.

In 1964, Shirley moved to New Zealand with her husband and her four children and in the years to follow their other three children were born. The family remained in Auckland till the mid nineties then shifted to South Taranaki.

Shirley was baptized into the Seventh Day Adventist Reform Movement along with Sis. Judy Paul by Bro. Merv Southwell at Paraki pools in the early nineties.

She will be remembered for her loving nature, kindness and be dearly missed by her family and friends but we are comforted by the hope of been reunited again at the resurrection.

Pope - "Sunday a human right"

Last year we reported ([GT E-News, Issue #8](#)) on the launch of the European Sunday Alliance, a coalition of 65 civil society organisations, trade unions and Churches who have committed to safeguarding and promoting work-free Sundays. As part of these efforts, on May 16 of this year, Pope Benedict XVI launched his appeal against Sunday working which was introduced not so long ago in Italy. During his address, reportedly attended by 11 thousand pilgrims, the Pope stated, "I also hope that Sunday, the Lord's Day and weekly celebration of His Resurrection, will be a day of rest and an opportunity to strengthen family ties." A few weeks later, in a pastoral visit to Milan, the Pope responded to a question on work/family time balance. In his response he stated, "And finally, there is Sunday, the day of celebration: I hope that Sunday is observed in America. Sunday, the Lord's Day, seems to me to be of great importance, and as such it is also "our day", because we are free. In the creation account, this was the Creator's original intention: that on one day we should all be free. In this freedom for one another, for ourselves, we are free for God. And this is how I think we defend human freedom, by defending Sunday and feast-days as the Lord's days and thus as our days." http://www.vatican.va/holy_father/benedict_xvi/speeches/2012/june/documents/hf_ben-xvi_spe_20120602_festa-testimonianze_en.html

While maintaining a healthy balance between work and family life is an important Christian principle, we believe defending Sunday for this purpose runs contrary to clear Biblical evidence that the seventh day of the week, Saturday, was the day ordained for this purpose. More importantly, we are opposed to the notion that a day of rest should be enshrined in law, which is the ultimate objective of the European Sunday Alliance. Arguably, no day needs legal protection. Millions around the globe choose to rest and worship on a day other than Sunday, even if this means inconvenience. They are a living testament to the fact that if a rest day is important enough, no one can make you work on it.

How far will the various Sunday alliances go in defending Sunday, contrary to the Bible? Prophecy indicates the whole world will be compelled to respect Sunday as a day of rest and religious observance. God is calling for us to take our stand in defense of truth and righteousness. In doing so we will find ourselves in direct opposition to the vast majority of Christendom. May God help us to be able to stand when the final test of our allegiance comes.

Welfare Department – Nadrau Project Appeal - Fiji

Dear Reader and Friends,

Recently an urgent appeal for assistance has come across the Welfare Department's Desk. High up in the Fiji Highlands' Nadrau Plateau, about 7 hours drive from the city of Suva along mostly unsealed roads and tracks, is a small group of members and visitors. They currently meet sitting down on the front porch of one of our Brother's house. They really need assistance in building a small church building. They are willing to supply all the timbers which they will cut using a chainsaw. They plan on making this a new place of worship with their own hands. The members and visitors are simple farmers who make a living from the volcanic soils. They have requested urgent assistance in monetary help in order to purchase the metal corrugated roofing iron. This iron and materials is to be used for the construction of a house of prayer.

The need is urgent for roofing and walls due to the hard driving rains that come down in this area. They will weave the side walls with local materials and complete this little place of prayer in a short time. The current need is for the metal roofing and a few bags of cement in order to secure the posts along with a few kilos of nails. If you find it in your heart to assist in this need please forward the funds no matter how small or large. They will multiply rapidly. We currently need \$2000.00 towards this little project. May the Lord richly bless the givers in this endeavour with a Bible verse the Brethren in Fiji have sent. Found in Hebrews 10:25 "Not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together as the manner of some is; but exhorting one another; and so much the more, as ye see the day approaching".
